<sup>1</sup>The influenza vaccine is no longer recommended for healthy adults age 60 to 74 or healthy children age 6 to 23 months. However, people who would like to get the vaccine, can do so free of charge.

<sup>2</sup>Pregnant persons with chronic diseases and pregnant persons in good health in their 2nd and 3rd trimester.

<sup>3</sup>Only for persons who have conditions that cause a decrease in the evacuation of respiratory secretions or the risk of aspiration.

<sup>4</sup>These include seizure disorders, febrile seizures and isolated developmental delays in children and neuromuscular, neurovascular, neurodegenerative, neurodevelopmental conditions and seizure disorders in adults, but exclude migraines and neuropsychiatric conditions without neurological conditions.
